Day Camp Parent Guide



WHAT TO BRING

- Spending money for the store or ice cream stand
- Quick drying comfortable clothing

Frequently Asked Questions



Here are some of the most commonly asked questions. If you have any others please do not hesitate to call our main office at 903.538.2711.

When does my camper check-in and check-out?

Drop off time is from 8:00-8:30 am at the Field House. Campers can be picked up from 5:00-5:30 pm at the Field House. If you need to drop off or pick up your camper anytime other than the scheduled times please let us know in advance.

What is included with day camp?

Campers will get a Lakeview buff, shirt and water bottle. Each day campers will be served snacks and lunch. All camp activities (ropes course, swimming, boating, arts and crafts, games, etc...) are included in the cost of camp.

Medications and Allergies - What if my child takes medication or has life threatening allergies?

All medication must be brought to camp in the original container (as purchased or issued) to turn in at arrival each day. Prescription containers must detail the child's name, name of medication, dosage directions, and the name of the person ordering the medication. If possible please administer medications before getting to camp.

Life threatening allergies (bee stings, food allergies, etc) need to be listed on the Health Form. Epi-Pens and Inhalers will be carried by your camper during the day.

Refunds - What is Lakeview's cancellation policy?

We offer a full refund for any reason if we are notified of a cancellation more than 4 weeks prior to the start of camp. If a camper cancels between 4 weeks and 2 weeks prior to the session starting, a 50% refund of the total cost of camp is available. If a camper cancels within 2 weeks of the session starting no refund will be issued.

What are Lakeview's Covid guidelines and procedures?

Lakeview is following applicable CDC recommendations. This includes increased cleaning and sanitation and moving camp activities outside as possible. Campers and staff will wear masks unless:

- Outside
- Eating
- Participating in physically demanding activities.

Campers and staff will have daily temperature checks and covid screening. If your camper is experiencing symptoms please do not come to camp. If you have any questions please let us know.

What do day camp campers get to do each day?

The schedule will vary each day so that campers have new and exciting things daily! Every day the campers will participate in:

- Activities (archery, bazookaball, neon dodgeball, crate stacking, fishing, boating and much more)
